EXCITING ENHANCEMENTS ARE COMING TO OUR PARK

On behalf of the Grant Township Board, we would like to inform you about the proposed park improvements that the Township is working on to create wonderful additions to our existing park. We know that this project will benefit the community with enjoyment for all.

We understand the importance of parks and how they enhance physical and mental well-being for our residents and visitors. Moreover, economic impact studies for parks in general identify their important benefits including increased property values, increased tax revenues and the benefits of exercise. The pandemic highlighted the need for public parks and spaces where people can enjoy the outdoors and reduce social isolation and the mental health issues that are related to it.

With assistance from professionals in their fields, we have been awarded a Grant through the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. The proposed project includes: Splash Pad; Fitness Station; Bocce Ball, Pickle Ball, Tennis Courts; Asphalt & Bike Trails, ADA Fishing Station and a 9 Hole Disc Golf Course.

We also received a second Grant from National Fitness Campaign 2023 Statewide Fitness Court Program to construct a Fitness Court. Construction is expected to start Spring 2024.

WATCH FOR CHILDREN

The Grant Township Highway Department would like to remind everyone that it's that time of year again when the kids are back in school. This means we could see more children walking and riding their bikes to and from school. Please be vigilant with keeping our kids safe. Remember to watch your speed in the school zones and as always, no texting or handheld phone use allowed while driving.



BE VISIBLE AT NIGHT

When walking at night wear light colored or reflective clothing to be visible. Drivers often do not expect walkers to be out after dark and you need to give them every chance to see you even at street crossings that have signal lights. Be cautious at dawn or twilight as drivers have limited visability or may even have the setting or rising sun directly in their eyes.

BURNING

Is burning still allowing in unincorporated Grant Township?

ALLOWED UNDER ORDINANCE

 Recreational wood-burning fires that are no larger than 3' x 3' x 3' if used for warming, cooking, and other recreational purposes.

PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES UNDER ORDINANCE

- Burning garbage, refuse, or construction materials (note that this has been prohibited for many years)
- Burning non-woody yard waste, such as leaves and grass.

RESTRICTED UNDER ORDINANCE

 Burning woody yard waste is permitted annually between Nov. 1- March 31. Woody yard waste generally consists of sticks, branches and tree limbs.



LEAF DISPOSAL OPTIONS

Fall signifies a time of year that is all too familiar with property owners-fall cleanup! As you glance at the colorful leaves now laying at your feet, here are some options to consider using or collecting those leaves this fall.



MULCHING

Leaf Mulch is simply chopped-up leaves. You can make it very easily; just run your lawnmower over the leaves. Once leaves are chopped, spread them over your garden beds to act as a mulch. You can also work them loosely into the top few inches of soil.



COMPOSTING

Leaves provide some of the building blocks for good compost! Collect them to start composting in and around your home. Check out some helpful tips from the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County to get started.



LEAF AND YARD WASTE COLLECTION

The County contracts with Groot Industries for weekly curbside waste collection. Neighborhood associations with pre-existing waste contracts are exempt. Yard waste is collected once per week from April 1st through First Full Week in December. Residents will have the option to choose between a pay per bag or subscription program for yard waste. BRUSH REMOVAL PROGRAM

The Highway Department offers brush pick-up as a service to the residents in unincorporated Grant Township areas. Brush pick-up Guidelines: 1) Brush is defined as branches trimmed from bushes, shrubs and trees by the homeowners. 2) Brush should be stacked with the stump side to the road.

Brush pick up is on Fridays. It is imperative your brush is out by the road on Thursday evening. The crew has a specific route they follow to get through the entire Township. Your brush will NOT get picked up if it is not out by the road once the crew pass through. You may email us at road5467@msn.com or call (847)546-7623 and give your address of where the brush needs to be picked up and we will add you to the list.

Please note if you hire a service to trim or remove trees or clear a lot, it is their responsibility to remove the brush.

Woodchips from collected brush are available for homeowner use at the Highway Department at 26535 W. Molidor Rd, Ingleside.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION UNDERWAY

PHASE 1: KNOLLWOOD IN DUCK LAKE WOODS

Residents last season had no reason to be unhappy as road resurfacing, curb and gutter work, storm sewer repairs and landscaping gave this area a much-needed face lift.

PHASE 2: DUCK LAKE WOODS

The department has completed most of the drainage restoration and is waiting for milling and grinding and new pavement of roads to be completed late September.

From the Assessor

DEAR GRANT TOWNSHIP PROPERTY OWNER,

As your Assessor, I would like to explain the 2023 Quadrennial, or township wide reassessment, that is currently underway. I receive many questions from taxpayers, and I hope this will answer some of them.

Q: What is a quadrennial (QUAD)?

A: It is a mass appraisal of all properties within an assessment jurisdiction for the purpose of ensuring that assessments are at a uniform percent of value. The QUAD year is the first year in a four-year cycle and will provide the base value for the three subsequent years. The Assessor's office will utilize property characteristic data on Property Record Cards (PRCs) and analyze sales from the 3 years prior to the lien date of January 1, 2023, to determine the full fair cash value for each property.

Q: I have not done anything to my parcel in years; shouldn't my assessed value stay the same?

A: No. Over the course of time, market value changes whether you do anything to your parcel or not.

Q: I appealed my value last year; shouldn't it stay the same?

A: Think of the QUAD year as a reset – all values are new and not based on any previous year's valuation. If you successfully appealed your assessed value before the Lake County Board of Review, those reductions do not carry forward into the QUAD year. The QUAD is also a reapportionment – value will shift throughout the township, throughout different property types and uses. The assessed value apportions the property tax burden and shifts in valuation will also shift the tax burden.

O: How does the Assessor determine market value?

A: The main determinant is a normal sale, also known as an arm's length transaction. We look at the prior 3 years sales (2020, 2021, 2022). 2019 sales will drop off the sales ratios and be replaced by much higher 2022 sales.

Q: What is an arm's length transaction?

A: An agreement between a willing and unrelated buyer and seller, both of whom are aware of all the facts and are acting in their own best interest. The sale occurs in an open and competitive market and given due time to utilize the market. Terms are expressed in cash.

Q: Are you saying that every sale does not determine market value?

A: Yes, sales that are non-arm's length transactions do not factor in. Examples are neighbor to neighbor, friend to friend, family, estate, auctions, land contracts and when the buyer is also a seller.

Q: What is the difference between sale price and market value?

A: Sale price is the price a buyer and seller agree to in one particular transaction. Market value is the result of the combined decisions of numerous buyers and sellers all coming to an agreement in an open market. The Assessor's office analyzes and uses this information to determine the assessed value.

Q: If my assessed value goes up, will my taxes go up?

The job of the Assessor is to determine what the market value of a parcel is worth. Taxes are figured by others. A quadrennial is done every four years to make the tax burden for all as fair as possible.



Q: You mention being fair. What exactly does that mean?

A: Fairness means impartiality and just treatment or behavior without favoritism or discrimination. The Assessor needs to treat everyone the same way to be fair and consistent. The only thing that matters is what a piece of property will sell for, in an open market, under normal conditions.

Q: I do not agree with my new assessed value, and I feel it should be changed. What should I do?

A: You have by law 30 days from the date of publication to appeal your 2023 assessment.

APPFAL INFORMATION

The 2023 property assessment notices are tentatively scheduled to be mailed to property owners in Grant Township on August 31. **This would mean the 30-day appeal period would be August 31st – October 2nd, 2023.** This date could still change so keep an eye out for any updates. It's important to read and understand this notice for accuracy as it contains important information about your property.

Property owners that decide to appeal must do so electronically. Property owners can appeal their assessment on their own through the Lake County Board of Review. No attorney is required for a



residential appeal. Appeals can be done in a few minutes by using the new **SmartFile E-Filing** Portal. This system allows you to electronically file most applications related to your property's assessment, and to change your mailing address. The first time you use the system, you need to select "new user" and create an account. You will enter an email and a password to register. Then check your email. A message will be sent with instructions to activate your account.

There are 6 reasons to appeal your assessment:

- 1. Factual error review your property characteristics, available at IMSLake.org to check for any errors
- 2. **Recent Purchase of Property** if you purchased your home in 2023
- 3. Recent Appraisal a recent real estate appraisal as of the January 1, 2023, lien date
- 4. Recent Sales Comparables you will need to populate a grid of comparable sales at IMSLake.org
- 5. Equity of Assessment Comparables you will need to populate a grid of equity comparables at IMSLake.org
- 6. Matter of Law and Other upload a legal brief or your own text describing the issue

Remember, you are not appealing your taxes, you are appealing the <u>full fair cash value</u> placed on your property. Please contact the Grant Township Assessor's office at (847)546-8880 if you have questions regarding the valuation of your property, or how to appeal.

VOTER REGISTRATION INFO

The general cut-off date for in-person voter registration for elections is 28 days prior to the election. Online voter registration is available until 16 days prior to an election. Visit ova.elections.il.gov to register online.

To register in person to vote you will need: 1) two forms of identification showing your current name and one showing your current physical address 2) you must be a US citizen 3) be 18 years old on or before the next election (or a 17 year old may register and vote in primaries if their 18th birthday occurs on or before the date of the general election) 4) live in the voting precinct 30 days prior to the election.

We have several voter registrars here at the Grant Township Office who can help register you to vote.

FOOD PANTRY NEEDS

Grant Township offers a full time food pantry available to residents Monday-Friday from 8:30am-4:00pm(closed holidays). Residents can receive a supply of non-perishable food items once per month with proof of residency.

The food pantry is generously funded through monetary and drop off donations from our neighbors and residents but recently we have found that we have low stock on a few particular items.
