



From the Assessor

A little bit of Property Tax relief in sight!

The Illinois Department of Revenue published their History of CPI's to be used for PTELL (Property Tax Extension Limit Law) on 01/31/2024. The PTELL cap % used for the 2024 December Levies will be 3.4%, down from 5.0% the past 2 years.

Spring is in the Air!

We've been enjoying some beautiful weather, enough to make you go outside, enjoy the fresh air and find some time to relax! I hope you all get to do that!

However, the assessment & tax cycle never end! ^(C) If you live in Round Lake, you should all be aware of the following referendum that will be on your March 19th primary ballot. I am not here to tell you how to vote, but I do want to let you know that this is how <u>you are directly involved in your tax bill</u>. You get to vote on how you want your tax dollars spent. The Round Lake Library has very detailed information on their website that will answer many of your questions.

The one question that you will all come to ask me about is how much will the proposed library increase your taxes? From the Round Lake Library website:

19. How much will the proposed library increase my taxes?

For a homeowner with a house at the median fair market value in our area of \$228.200, the library's tax rate will increase approximately \$0.95 per day (\$28.82 monthly).

Lake County Board of Review

Qualified Professionals Needed for Board of Review Hearing Officers!

The Lake County Board of Review acts as an unbiased intermediary between assessors & taxpayers. The Board's hearing officers play an important role in striving for equitable & fair property assessments in Lake County through the assessment appeal process.

Hearing officers hear testimony on written appeals of any real estate parcel that is claimed to be over-assessed or under-assessed. The Board reviews the assessment & either deems it to be just or corrects it as necessary.

You must have experience in real estate & pass a qualifying

exam given by the Department of Revenue. Qualified candidates can serve in any county within Illinois.

Lake County Board of Review Hearings are anticipated to take place between August -December daily from 8:30am-4:30pm in Waukegan. Scheduling is flexible depending on the officer's availability.

Lake County Hearing Officers act as independent contractors & are paid \$285/day.

The Qualifying Exam is being administered on Thursday, March 21, 2024 10am-Noon at the McHenry County Administration Building, 667 Ware Road, Conference Room B, Woodstock, IL 60098. 
Dialing 988 is available to everyone across the United States. If you (or if you are worried about a loved one) can call or text 988 are in need of crisis support. 988 offers 24/7 access to trained crisis counselors who can help people experiencing mental health-related distress, including thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance abuse crises, emotional distress or other reasons.

Callers with a Lake County area code who call 988 are routed to the Health Department Crisis Care Line. In some instances, the person over the phone can be provided referrals to resources such as shelter, food pantry, Wellness Center or other social service agencies.

If in-person intervention is requested, the Health Department Mobile Response team will respond to the individual wherever they are.



I-PASS Sticker Tags Are Here

Available at Illinois Tollway Customer Service Centers, on line Available at Illinois Tollway Customer Service Centers, online and at Jewel-Osco & RoadRanger stores!



Once registered to your I-PASS account, the I-PASS Sticker Tag will be immediately ready to use on the Illinois Tollway & within 24 hours on the Chicago Skyway or other E-ZPass roadways. Existing transponders will continue to work as designed on the Illinois Tollway and our E-ZPass partners' facilities. Customers will not be required to switch to I-PASS Sticker Tag if they have a working transponder.

What Customers Need to Know

- No charge for I-PASS Sticker Tags, and no deposit required for I-PASS Sticker Tags obtained at an Illinois Tollway Customer Service Center or ordered online. A retail service fee will be required at <u>Jewel-Osco</u> and <u>RoadRanger</u> stores.
- The \$10 transponder deposit will be transferred into current I-PASS customer's prepaid toll account balance once a new I-PASS Sticker Tag is registered to the account.
- Sticker Tags are not transferable, 1 sticker tag per vehicle, permanently installed to windshield
- No batteries, so no need to swap out and and safer for our environment.
- Old transponders can be recycled at a location near you. Use the link <u>here</u> and search for lithium-ion batteries and your zip code.

Secretary of State Homebound State ID Program

The Homebound State ID program is a service program for older adults, bedridden individuals & people with disabilities who are unable to leave their homes to obtain a state ID card from a Secretary of State facility.



The card may be used for identification purposes in the same way as a standard driver's license is used for identification. Certain documents are required to obtain the card. Once an applicant submits the information via our web form below, we will determine eligibility and the documents required to complete the transaction.
